




\$27,755.92 2022 Total Expenditures


A breakdown of AFP Utah Chapter's expenditures by category for 2022.



FINANCIALS 2022 COMPARED TO 2021


2021 PROFITS






FINANCIALS 2022 COMPARED TO 2021
